### 4 & 8 WEEK COURSES

#### CHE 123 CHEMISTRY & SOCIETY

3 credits, 12:30 - 3:15 p.m., TTh Franz, Class #1994

8 week course (June 8 - July 31)

A course for non-science majors that covers basic chemistry concepts in a social context. May include explorations of how chemistry impacts the environment, public health, energy policies, and other contemporary social issues. Consists of lectures and may also include discussions and demonstrations. Not a suitable prerequisite for higher-level chemistry courses or pre-professional programs. (A student may not earn more than four credits by taking CHE 123 and CHE 124.) NS

#### COM 103 INTRO TO PUBLIC SPEAKING

3 credits, 9:00 - 11:45 a.m., TTh, Wiesner, Class #1996

8 week course (June 8 - July 31)

Study of the principles and techniques of effective speaking and listening in a variety of selected communication experiences. AP

#### MAT 105 INTRO TO COLLEGE ALGEBRA

3 credits, 9:00 - 11:45 a.m., MW, Friess, Class #1997

8 week course (June 8 - July 31)

Emphasizes algebraic techniques with polynomials, fractional expressions, exponents and radicals, linear and quadratic equations, and inequalities. Introduction to functions, their graphs and analytic geometry. Prereq: A grade of C or better in Elementary Algebra or placement based on placement test score. EL

#### MAT 110 COLLEGE ALGEBRA

3 credits, 9:00 - 11:45 a.m., MW, van Groningen, Class #1998

8 week course (June 8 - July 31)

Definition of function; linear and non-linear functions and graphs including logarithmic and exponential functions; systems of linear equations; theory of polynomial equations and optional topics such as mathematical induction, matrix solution of linear systems and Cramer's rule. Prereq: A grade of C or better in MAT 105 or placement based on placement test score. MS

#### PHI 211 ELEMENTARY LOGIC

3 credits, 9:00 - 11:45 a.m., MW, Kozma, Class #1999

8 week course (June 8 - July 31)

Principles, standards and methods of distinguishing good reasoning from bad, as applied to deductive and inductive inferences. The course largely consists of substituting symbols for statements in arguments and understanding and assessing the logical structure of these arguments. May include a discussion of the nature and detection of fallacies and linguistic pitfalls affecting reasoning. MS

#### SOC 101 INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY

3 credits, 12:30 - 3:15 p.m., MTWTh, Anand, Class #2005

4 week course (July 13 - August 7)

Introduction to the basic concepts, theories and methods of sociology, emphasizing the significance of the self and culture, social process and organization, and forces of social stability and change. SS

All classes are subject to change or cancellation.

### ONLINE COURSE FEES

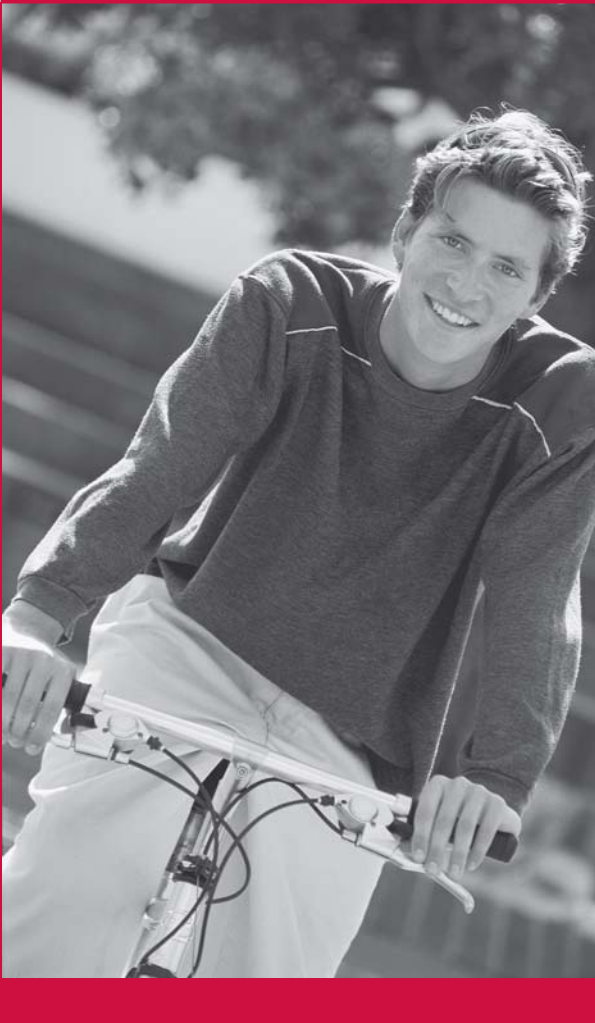
UWC Online course tuition and fees differ from other UWC tuition:

**Summer 2009 Online tuition:** \$205 per credit. Online tuition is refundable according to the standard tuition refund policy and calendar.

**Registration fee:** There is a \$60 registration fee per course for online courses. This fee is nonrefundable after the day online registration closes, **May 21, 2009**. Your seat in the course is not secure until your online tuition is paid in full or an adequate amount of financial aid has been confirmed. Students who have not paid will be withdrawn from the course when the course becomes full or at the close of online registration on May 21.

## ENROLLING IS EASY



Summer is a great time to take a class or two at UW-Barron County. You can earn a few credits to fulfill a degree requirement, to transfer to another university, or just for personal enrichment.

If you are attending another college or university, are in high school, or are a community resident you can apply and register online as a 'special student' at [www.apply.wisconsin.edu](http://www.apply.wisconsin.edu). An application fee is not required. Students enrolled during the spring semester at UW-BC may simply register online through PRISM.

High school students who have just completed their junior year should be in the top 25% of their class and provide a high school transcript and a recommendation from their school along with their application.

Those who plan to continue at UW-BC beyond summer session need to complete a UW System Application for Undergraduate Admission and submit all appropriate transcripts and fees.

Instructions on how to access PRISM, our online registration system, to register for courses will be sent with an admission letter.

Need-based summer scholarships are also available for UW-BC degree students. Partial payment plans are not available for summer tuition.
